We were pleased to announce that Penn's new Vice President for the Division of Public Safety (DPS) is Kathleen Shields Anderson, who has worked in DPS for the past decade. Penn's new Vice President for Development and Alumni Relations is Jim Husson, who comes to us from Boston College and will officially begin his duties in October. And our new Vice President for Finance and Treasurer is Mark Dingfield. Also beginning his tenure in October, Mark is currently Associate Provost for Finance and Planning. I hope you will join me in congratulating and welcoming them all.

Penn also continues to host prominent world leaders for important engagement opportunities on campus. An excellent example is the September 13th Perry World House event featuring former Australian Prime Minister Malcolm Turnbull on the urgent challenges of climate change. The event also features new Penn faculty member and prominent environmental scientist Michael Mann, who is the inaugural director of Penn's new Center for Science, Sustainability, and the Media. The moderator is Dr. Kathleen Hall Jamieson, renowned communications expert, director of the Annenberg Center for Public Policy, and co-founder of FactCheck.org. This event exemplifies the many ways Penn's students, faculty experts, and staff engage globally on the biggest issues we face today.

PROVOST'S STATUS REPORT

University Council – September 2022

It is a great pleasure to be back with all of you for the fall semester. I hope that everyone had a great summer and is enjoying the first weeks of classes. It is a particular pleasure to welcome President Magill as we look ahead to another year of important work on Council. I am also very pleased to welcome <u>Will Atkins</u>, who joined us in July as Associate Vice Provost for University Life with oversight of Diversity, Equity, Inclusion, and Belonging, and to thank Tamara Greenfield King for her outstanding service as Interim Vice Provost for University Life. We have begun the search process for a new Vice Provost for University Life, and we welcome input from every member of the community on this critical role. There will be a community meeting for the search on September 20 from 4:30-5:30 in the Class of '49 Auditorium in Houston Hall, at which all members of the Penn community are invited to provide input and suggestions. This semester, we are also beginning the University's process of reaccreditation by the Middle States Commission on Higher Education. This process begins with a campus-wide Self-Study Report and culminates in a site visit in 2024 by an external team that will issue its own report and recommendations. On September 15, from 12-1 pm, we will host a Zoom meeting with Dr. Idna Corbett, Lead Vice President of the Middle States Commission on Higher Education, at which all members of the Penn community can learn more about the reaccreditation process and provide input on this year's Self-Study theme, *Inclusively and Effectively Educating the Whole Person for the 21st Century*. We will also talk more about the Self-Study process at the October Council meeting, led by Vice Provost for Education Karen Detlefsen.

September 13 marks the beginning of <u>GradFest</u>, the annual twelve-day celebration of graduate and professional students, which will culminate in the 21st birthday celebration of the <u>Graduate</u> <u>Student Center</u>. Other events include a <u>welcome reception</u> and happy hour at the LGBT Center, a Saturday morning <u>brunch and playdate</u> at the Family Center, a campus food truck tour, a trip to Reading Terminal Market and Chinatown, and the first <u>GAPSA</u> general assembly meeting of the year, followed by a reception for graduate and professional students to meet their GAPSA representatives. I want to remind doctoral students of three important programs with deadlines of September 23: <u>Health Insurance Grants</u> to offset the cost of health insurance for PhD students who are no longer funded by their departments; <u>Dental Insurance Grants</u> to reimburse half the cost of the <u>Penn Dental Student Insurance Plan</u>; and <u>Family Grants and Dependent Insurance</u> <u>Grants</u> to offset the costs of childcare and/or dependent health insurance.

I look forward to working together in the semester ahead!
